HOPE provides access for those in need of essential resources (food/vouchers), comprehensive support services (financial literacy/outreach events), all while fostering a sense of community to encourage personal growth. HOPE does this through its own programs and direct referrals to partner agencies. The internal work of HOPE Helps fall into four pillars:

Housing, Outreach, Prevention & Education.

Housing: Providing vital support to at risk populations by way of financial assistance, a choice food pantry, individualized case plans/goals & referrals to affordable housing agencies in order to keep people in their homes. HOPE's mission & vision empowers individuals to become and stay selfsufficient, avoiding homelessness...which only creates more homeless specific programs, increased housing/living costs & adds to the weight of human tragedy and disparity.

Outreach: HOPE's outreach approach focuses on building awareness of the assistance, services and the prevention model HOPE provides in the community. This benefits our clients by alleviating immediate needs for school & holidays with HOPE's outreach events. HOPE also has a voucher program where our case managers issue vouchers to our clients to obtain clothing and houseware needs free of charge at HOPE's Thrift Store, The HOPE Chest.

Prevention: HOPE's strategic mission revolves around proactively preventing hunger and homelessness. We are dedicated to addressing root causes of vulnerability with intervention, developing a unique case plan and services. By equipping our clients with the skills and resources they need to achieve stability, we contribute to a community-wide safety net that prevents the easy slide into poverty which, in turn, fosters a more resilient community.

Education: Here at HOPE, we use strategy to empower individuals in need to chart their own path to success. We're committed to providing educational materials, interactive workshops & personalized coaching. We believe in fostering a sense of accountability & confidence to take charge of their future. Through these initiatives, we create a supportive environment that boosts their chances of success and equips them with the tools necessary for sustained self-sufficiency, leading to a more powerful life journey.

# **Resource Center**

HOPE serves the working poor, many clients who have never been in crisis before, and the homeless. We believe in equipping individuals and families with the tools necessary to get them through their crisis by offering case management, financial assistance and access to additional resources.

- \$125,757 paid in financial assistance for rent and utilities
- Our Financial Freedom Series offers clients workshops throughout the year including one-on-one, group classes, and financial literacy counseling
- HOPE now has 13 financial counselors who conducted 122 sessions in 2024 to help with client budgeting
- HOPE's Case Managers meet with clients to identify needs and create a personalized case plan to help them return to self-sufficiency
- Education/Computer Center for resume building, food stamp and job applications
- HOPE Hosted 88 financial literacy classes, with 461 signups
- 1,282 individual clients from 446 families received \$21,113 worth of hygiene products in 2024

HOPE is dedicated to providing comprehensive financial literacy education to those who may be receiving financial assistance. Through HOPE's Financial Freedom Series, individuals can access free workshops that cover essential topics like budgeting, establishing savings, and credit counseling, all designed to foster financial stability and empowerment. To offer personalized support and a tailored approach to financial goal-setting, HOPE also provides one-on-one coaching sessions, which can be delivered virtually or in-person, ensuring that those in need have access to the resources and tools required to build a more secure, and self sufficient future. HOPE's financial literacy team is comprised of dedicated financial experts and financial banking institution partners.

# **Food Pantry**

HOPE's Food Pantry is one of the only choice food pantries in Seminole County that provides healthy nonperishable food, produce, meat and fresh bread, 4-days per week, all at no charge for those in need. The pantry is supported by local businesses, individual donors, faith groups and food drives, along with weekly purchases at Second Harvest Food Bank.

#### 2024 included:

- 9,944 visits to the pantry, including emergency food distribution
- \$32,500 donated for fresh produce by private donors
- 520 emergency food bags distributed
- Clients are led through the pantry by a "Shepherd" to choose their food each week including items like fresh produce, bread, meat, and more
- Supported by a large team of dedicated volunteers and faith, civic, business, and individual groups that participate in **Pantry Takeover Days**
- Dozens of food drives held by community members, faith groups, schools, civic groups, and businesses throughout the community
- At HOPE, we are committed to providing food services to anyone who
  walks in to our facility. The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)
  is an option provided by HOPE to ensure no one leaves empty-handed


Worth of food distributed in 2024

HOPE's financial health is strong and well diversified, relying on a mix of monetary and non-monetary support. The organization's financial stability is rooted in its varied revenue streams. The HOPE Chest Thrift Store is the primary revenue driver, accounting for roughly 48% of the total revenue (excluding inkind donations). Based upon HOPE Chest's continued growth, this solidifies its position as the top revenue source. Monetary contributions coming from a mix of individuals, corporations, and faith groups make up 31% of the organization's revenue, showing significant community support. Grants contribute another 13% while fundraising events account for the remaining 8%.


HOPE continues to see a growth in in-kind donations. These non-monetary contributions, which include food, hygiene products, and volunteer hours, are a critical component of HOPE's operational capacity. This trend indicates not just financial strength, but a deep and expanding level of community engagement. The combination of a successful thrift store, consistent financial contributions, and a rising tide of non-monetary support paints a clear picture of a healthy and well-supported organization.

# A Story of HOPE- Jack

HOPE's HENS program provides assistance to clients that are elderly, disabled, or homebound and cannot get to HOPE's facilities.

Jack, who was living on a limited income from social security disability, sought assistance for food from HOPE Helps. This need was met compassionately by our HENS (HOPE's Emergency Network System) program. Suffering from Post-Polio Syndrome and other debilitating medical conditions that confined him to a wheelchair, Jack faced considerable challenges in accessing basic necessities.

Our HENS program, specifically tailored for individuals who are homebound due to medical issues, stepped in to fill this gap for Jack. Our dedicated team ensured that he received not only weekly food deliveries to his apartment but also monthly hygiene products. This service transcended beyond physical aid; one of our volunteers who regularly delivered these necessities forged a deep bond with Jack, offering companionship and emotional support alongside the material assistance. This relationship exemplifies the spirit of community and empathy that drives HOPE Helps.

The HENS program not only addressed his immediate needs for food and hygiene products but also provided him with invaluable case management support and a sense of belonging. His experience underscores the transformative power of our programs and the generosity of our volunteers and donors, whose contributions enable us to continue making a real difference in the lives of those like Jack.




















# **Volunteerism at HOPE**

## HENS

HOPE's Emergency Network Service, HENS, provides outreach to those who are elderly, disabled, or suffering from medical issues, and are home-bound and unable to access HOPE's Services on site. This includes food and hygiene products.

- Over 1,196 home deliveries made to elderly or disabled home bound clients
- Case Managers meet with clients at their homes to learn about their needs, then pair them with a volunteer delivery driver
- Volunteers visit clients and report back to case managers, notifying them of any additional needs
- Volunteers prepare food bags from HOPE's Food Pantry, adhering to their dietary needs (gluten/sugar free, etc.,) and deliver to the client's home each week

# **Sham Rock N Run 5k**

On Saturday, March 9th, 2024, HOPE's 13th Annual Sham Rock N' Run 5k, presented by Oviedo Medical Center, took place at St. Luke's Lutheran Church. Every year, hundreds of participants of widely varying age and athletic ability come together dressed in their St. Patty's best and complete the course in support of HOPE. This event raises funds to help families in crisis in our community through HOPE's various programs. Each individual who walks, runs, skips, or hops their way to the finish line has a hand in keeping families in need in their homes.

- All finisher's received a custom Sham Rock N' Run medals and tshirts
- Virtual and "Snooze for HOPE" options were made available for participants who could not attend on race day
- Residents from Lutheran Haven cheered on racers through the 3.1 mile course, hosted by St. Luke's Lutheran Church/School
- The Little Leprechaun Lap, a free race for young children, is also available...promoting a family-friendly event

# **Kids of HOPE Enrichment Program**

- Kids of HOPE food bags are distributed weekly during school breaks at the Resource Center, which include fresh fruit, dairy and easy open items for children who may be home alone while their parents work.
- Parents have the opportunity during bag distribution to meet with a case manager and discuss any personal situations or needs, all while creating a personalized case plan to meet their overall goals.
- In 2024, Orlando Health sponsored the Kids of HOPE Enrichment Program, providing more than 2,797 breakfast & lunch bags to 636 children during the 14 weeks a year children are out of school.
- The Kids of HOPE program has alleviated hunger and reduced costs by a total of \$88,664 for families.
- HOPE partners with Seminole County Public School's Families in Need (FIN) program, cohosting a semi-annual Kids of HOPE registration event at HOPE, connecting as many families as possible to these services.
- In 2024, hundreds of volunteers and groups decorated KOH food bags, a volunteer opportunity HOPE offers to all age groups.

During each break throughout the school year, children who typically receive free or reduced meal plans at school may go without. The Kids of HOPE Enrichment Program fills the gap, allowing parents to register to receive healthy breakfasts and lunches for their children. When parents arrive at HOPE they are then given education about additional resources at HOPE.

\$47 per month: Provides nutritious Kids of HOPE food bags for one child for one year.

\$94 per month: Provides two children Kids of HOPE food bags for one year.

\$234 per month: Provides five children Kids of HOPE food bags for one year.

# **Kids of HOPE Back to School Bash**

HOPE's Back to School Bash, presented by Orlando Health, provides disadvantaged children with an opportunity to choose everything they need to start their school year off right.

- During the event, preregistered children receive new backpacks, pencils, pens, glue, notebooks, paper, socks, underwear, hygiene and more
- In 2024, children received free vision screenings and glasses from HOPE's partner, Lions Club Right to Sight
- More than 200 volunteers helped put on this event at First Methodist Church of Oviedo
- Local businesses and churches hosted school supply collection boxes to provide over \$91,467 worth of school supplies for children in Seminole County
- \$384 worth of clothing was distributed through The HOPE Chest Thrift Store/Boutique, and \$11,070 of new socks (from Bombas) and underwear distributed at the Back to School Bash event
